James 2:1-5 – "My brothers and sisters, believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ must not show favoritismIf you show special attention to the man wearing fine clothes and say, 'Here's a good seat for you,' but you say to the poor man, 'You stand there' or 'Sit on the floor by my feet,' have you not discriminated among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts?  Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Has not God chosen those who are poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom he promised those who love him?"
What James has to say, is an abnormal way of looking at, but that is the way!
Look at it this way: It's not normal for the Son of God to give his life for our sins.
