## January 8, 2017 <u>"You Are A Child Of God...Uh-Oh!"</u> (Matthew 3:13-17)

Baptism should not be a mere \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the church that we go through without some deep \_\_\_\_\_\_ searching and prayer.

One reason baptism is an "uh-oh" event is that it represents \_\_\_\_\_\_ on our part.

We are becoming part of the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of Christ. That means we are becoming a vital part of the \_\_\_\_\_\_.

Why did Christ go to John the Baptist to be baptized? Some possibilities:

## #1.- He may have wanted to \_\_\_\_\_\_ with the ministry and message of John.

There are those who would portray John as \_\_\_\_\_\_ on sin and Jesus as \_\_\_\_\_\_ on the same subject.

Jesus was compassionate with sinners, but not with \_\_\_\_\_!

It's tragic for 2 reasons:

If it seems that being baptized by a rough-cut preacher like John was humbling, remember that \_\_\_\_\_\_ himself was what his whole ministry was about.

Why? Because that was the only way he could fulfill his mission of seeking and \_\_\_\_\_\_ the lost. He laid down his \_\_\_\_\_ for us.

A humble carpenter of Nazareth set out not only to \_\_\_\_\_\_ a bridge between God and humanity, but to \_\_\_\_\_\_ that bridge!

## #3.- He was indicating to us the path we are to take in our Christian \_\_\_\_\_\_.

We, too, are to submit to baptism as an act of \_\_\_\_\_\_ with Christ's message and ministry.

We have a place of \_\_\_\_\_\_ and security within that will never fail us as we strive to live \_\_\_\_\_\_ in him and give ourselves to him in baptism.

How symbolic, the place of Christ's baptism is a spot of \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_\_ amid a furious flowing river of hate and strife.

Whether at this location on the Jordan, or another, Jesus found refuge from the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of life, at the place of his baptism.

When difficulties seem more than we can bear, going back to our baptismal experience puts it all into \_\_\_\_\_\_.

I hope that everyone here understands what an important and beautiful rite of the church it is.
