IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home: With God all things are possible. When a man named Saul was hunting down Christians to arrest them, he had an encounter with God that changed his life. He would become the greatest missionary in the church's history. Today, God continues to use missionaries in countries like Haiti to change people's lives. Acts 9:1-19.



M HANGING OUT:
