#### Jonah 3

<sup>1</sup>Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time: <sup>2</sup>"Go to the great city of Nineveh and proclaim to it the message I give you."

<sup>3</sup>Jonah obeyed the word of the LORD and went to Nineveh. Now Nineveh was a very important city—a visit required three days. <sup>4</sup>On the first day, Jonah started into the city. He proclaimed: "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overturned." <sup>5</sup>The Ninevites believed God. They declared a fast, and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth.

<sup>6</sup>When the news reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, took off his royal robes, covered himself with sackcloth and sat down in the dust. <sup>7</sup>Then he issued a proclamation in Nineveh:

"By the decree of the king and his nobles:

Do not let any man or beast, herd or flock, taste anything; do not let them eat or drink. <sup>8</sup>But let man and beast be covered with sackcloth. Let everyone call urgently on God. Let them give up their evil ways and their violence. <sup>9</sup>Who knows? God may yet relent and with compassion turn from his fierce anger so that we will not perish."

<sup>10</sup>When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, he had compassion and did not bring upon them the destruction he had threatened.



#### Jonah 3:1-10

#### CRAFT/ACTIVITY: MEGAPHONES

Students will make megaphones to remind them that Jonah preached that the city of Nineveh would be destroyed in 40 days.

#### **MATERIALS**

- 1. Megaphone Pattern
- 2. 67 lb. Cardstock
- 3. Glue
- 4. Crayons, Markers or Colored Pencils
- 5. Scissors



#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Copy a "Megaphone Pattern" onto 67 lb cardstock for each student.
- 2. Have students color in the word "repent" on the megaphone patterns.
- 3. Cut out the megaphone on the solid black line.
- 4. Glue the tab to the opposite side.

#### FOR DISCUSSION

As students are working on their megaphones, remind them that Jonah told the people of Nineveh that the city would be destroyed in 40 days. The people of Nineveh repented and wore sackcloth to show the Lord that they were sorry. The Lord had compassion on the people and did not destroy the city.





The people also wore sackcloth which is a rough material that itches the body. This also was to show how sorry they were. The king told the people to pray to God.

The people did what the king told them. God saw that they were sorry and decided not to destroy the city of Nineveh.
